

ACCESS

The city of Mitoyo is located in the western part of Kagawa Prefecture. It can be reached from the Kansai region in about 2.5 hours on the Nozomi Shinkansen Bullet Train and in about 3.5 hours by car via expressway routes. It is surprisingly close.



The View from Mt. Shiude

Mt. Shiude is located on the Shonai Peninsula, which of two different parts of the Seto Inland Sea.





In the evening, the Hiuchinada waters glow with the rays of the setting sun, reflecting them like a mirror. This spectacular scene is visible from different places in Mitoyo.







Bathed in a warm golden hue, this is the sunset scene on the coastal road running along Hiuchinada. In the distance is Ibukijima, an island whose waters are famous for fishing small sardines that are dried before shipment.

Kotohira-gu Shrine

One of the most famous Shinto shrines in Japan, Kotohira-gu Shrine is reached only after climbing a total of 1.368 stone steps. Inside the shrine, visitors can see "Tigers", a painting on fusuma sliding doors, by Okyo Maruyama, an 18th-century artist whose work remains very popular in Japan.

Zentsuji Temple

Zentsuji Temple was built at the birthplace of Kobo Daishi, the founder of Shingon Buddihism, and is the main temple of the Shingon Buddihism Zentsuji sect. The temple continues to attract a steady stream of devoted faithful, and is the 75th temple on the famed Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage route. The expansive grounds include many interesting structures, such as Kondo (the main hall) and the five-story pagoda.

> Ritsurin Garden 特別名勝 栗林公園

Originating in the days of daimyo feudal lords, Ritsurin Garden was awarded three stars in the Michelin Green Guide Japan. It encompasses no less than six ponds and thirteen artificial mounds. On the grounds are also structures of historical value, such as teahouses and Shoko Shoreikan (Commerce and Industry Promotion Hall).

Mt. Yashima has a mesa-type shape, which is unusual in Japan. Yashima gets its name from the flat shape, and was the site of a medieval battle. The mesa is topped with a lookout point, teahouse,

and Yashima-ji Temple (the 84th temple on the Shikoku Pilgrimage). The mountain offers spectacular views of many islands in the Seto Inland Sea and downtown Takamatsu.


Nakatsu Banshoen Garden

Burial Graves

A final resting place for islanders

In this area, it is customary to make two graves, one to hold the deceased (the burial grave) and the other for people to visit. The burial graves of Shishijima take the form of little houses.

Enter the trail on the way from the port to the huge camphor tree, and you can reach the summit within 15 to 25 minutes. A panoramic view of the expanse of sea and nearby islands awaits on top.



The Urashima Taro Legend of the Shonai Peninsula

One of the most famous folktales in Japan is Urashima Taro, a story about a young villager who is taken to a fantastic underwater castle by a turtle he saves. He meets a princess there who gives him a kind of Pandora's box with instructions to never open it. When he returns home, many years have passed. Eventually, he decides to open the box and mysterious smoke comes out. He is then turned into an old man. The Shonai Peninsula in Mitoyo is considered to be one of the most likely candidates as the setting of the story. There are place names similar to those in the legend and many related cultural events dating from ancient times.
