Getting Around



Most of Shishijima's roads are extremely narrow with lots of slopes and staircases. Neither cars nor bikes are a viable means of transportation, and visitors should expect to do a fair amount of walking.

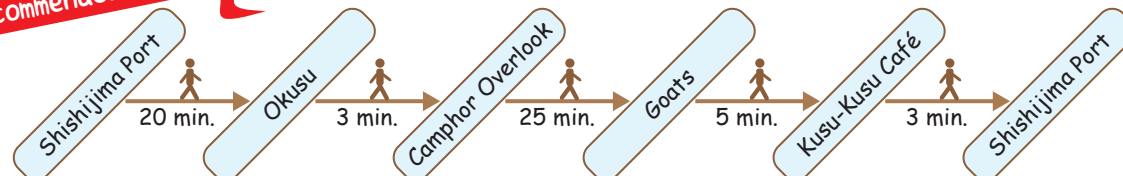

Island Idols

Possibly the most famous and well-liked residents of the islands are its goats. These cute little lawnmowers are typically found near the port area, but occasionally move to other areas of the island when duty calls. Ask at Kusu-Kusu to find out where they're working during your visit.



Recommended Course



1 Okusu: The Great Camphor Tree

Deep within the hills at the center of the island is a 1,200-year-old camphor tree, Okusu. The path to Okusu is steep and often muddy, so visitors should wear comfortable shoes.

2 Camphor Overlook

A quick hike to the West of Okusu brings you to this cute, handcrafted hut with a gorgeous view

5 Burial Cottages

The islands in this area of the Seto Inland Sea traditionally divided graves into two: one where the family can come to pay their respects, and one that houses the body in peace and quiet. These small, house-like structures are the latter.

3 Skyview Meadow April - June

In the island's heyday, Shishijima was covered in fields of different flowers, giving the island a patchwork appearance from the air. Most of these fields have since disappeared, but certain residents are working to revive them, starting here.
